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INTRODUCTION

The driving force of the state action strategy is the state and its organs. The guarantee of reforms is an event associated with the effective functioning of the state. In this regard, our president insisted that it is necessary to strengthen control over the adoption of parliamentary decisions and the implementation of laws, optimize the system of executive power, continue Administrative Reforms and widely use modern management methods in public administration, attract qualified specialists. Primarily the civil service, it provided guidance on policy development, redefining the powers and responsibilities of local authorities, and further strengthening their independence.

New institutions introduced into constitutional legislation in recent years play an important role in further improving the system of public administration, creating effective organizational and legal mechanisms of relations between government structures (Parliament, President, Government).

In particular, the law of the Republic of Uzbekistan, adopted on April 18, 2011, became an important legal basis for further democratization of the system of state power. Amendments to Article 98 of the Basic Law at the previous stage of reforms played an important role in achieving a decent distribution of powers between the subjects of power.

In early 2019, say movements began on the initiative of the Joint Program with the United Arab Emirates in order to improve the effectiveness of Public Administration in Uzbekistan. The Uzbek delegation, consisting of representatives of ministries, departments, economic bodies and educational institutions, visited the

United Arab Emirates to participate in the second meeting of the working group of the Intergovernmental program "improving the efficiency of Public Administration".

The main purpose of the visit is to study the experience of the United Arab Emirates in creating a system of Public Administration and further introduction of an alternative concept into Uzbekistan, to hold a second meeting of working groups, to discuss the "path" of 2019. 2020 development and approval of the "map" in different directions. After President Shavkat Mirziyoyev's visit to the UAE in March, bilateral ties between Uzbekistan and the UAE reached a new level.

During the visit, the parties agreed on the initiative of the joint program "improving the effectiveness of Public Administration", and the seminar scheduled for May is a logical continuation of the program.

President Shavkat Mirziyoyev said that the modernization of the government is one of the priorities of the country, and international experience will help to increase its effectiveness. On May 5, Deputy Prime Minister of the Republic of Uzbekistan Aziz Abduhakimov, Minister of Justice Ruslanbek Davletov, Deputy Minister of investments and foreign trade Shuhrat Vafoev and director of the State Committee for Tourism Development and foreign investment Kudratov Laziz. During the meeting, Al-Gergawi stressed the importance of teamwork in order to achieve practical results in health, education, economics, etc.

The visit of the Uzbek delegation to the UAE demonstrates that the government is committed to strengthening bilateral cooperation in improving governance. According to the Minister of the United Arab Emirates, ensuring high efficiency in the development of government activities is an important part of the UAE's efforts to secure the future. The United Arab Emirates expressed satisfaction with its successful experience in developing and implementing new business models.

In improving public services, the law of the Republic of Uzbekistan "on E-Government" is important. In accordance with the law, ensuring the effectiveness, speed and transparency of the activities of state bodies, strengthening their responsibility and executive discipline, electronic document of business entities, the use of circulation is defined, including the transfer to the use of electronic document circulation in the processes of submission of statistical reporting, customs clearance, issuance of licenses, permits, certificates, as well as in the processes of obtaining information from state bodies.
