"Turkey's acceptance as a candidate for EU membership increases the importance of political parties even more. After all, political parties are undoubtedly the creators of economic, political and social reforms at the level of Turkey's cooperation with the European Union. More importantly, political parties are at the center of democracy in the countries of the European Union that have accepted Turkey as a candidate for their membership. Several researches have been conducted on the activities of political parties in Turkey. parties showed what changes should be made in this regard. Relations between Uzbekistan and Turkey are growing promisingly from year to year. In particular, the fact that our country is a member of the Cooperation Council of Turkic-speaking countries at the international level also shows this. Last year

In September, at the initiative of President Shavkat Mirziyoyev, the Republic of Uzbekistan became a member of the Cooperation Organization of Turkic-Speaking Countries, all Turkic countries, first of all, actively supported the Republic of Turkey. Opportunities for bilateral cooperation have been created.

The presidents exchanged views on the proposal to establish modern joint clinics and diagnostic centers in the fields of oncohematology, cardiosurgery, ophthalmology, implementation of joint educational programs in the fields of small business, textiles, and training specialists for clusters. Cooperation between Uzbekistan and Turkey has become more active, especially in the last three years. The state visits of Shavkat Mirziyoyev to Turkey in October 2017 and of Recep Tayyip Erdogan to Uzbekistan in April 2018 strengthened mutual political trust and paved the way for effective cooperation. The meeting noted the importance of expanding transport links and establishing multimodal international transport to Europe through Turkey. The issues of adopting Turkey's advanced experience in the areas of intensive horticulture, fisheries, animal husbandry, breeding, conducting joint research with universities and scientific centers were discussed. In the negotiations, it was emphasized the need to regularly hold meetings of the intergovernmental commission on trade and economic cooperation in order to use mutually beneficial opportunities and implement new projects and programs. Turkey is also famous for its developed textile industry. It is planned to establish textile enterprises in our country with the leading companies of Turkey and fully process the grown cotton, introduce certification for the finished product and direct it to the world market. Mutually beneficial friendly relations between our countries are steadily developing. Communication at all levels has intensified. Uzbekistan and Turkey are constantly supporting each other within the framework of international organizations. The President of Turkey noted that the negotiations between the two countries were held in the spirit of mutual solidarity, mutual interest and trust, and the cooperation between Turkey and Uzbekistan was further strengthened and raised to a strategic level. In order to further strengthen the legal foundations of Uzbekistan-Turkey cooperation, 24 documents on economy, trade, transport-logistics, industry, science, education, tourism and other fields were signed between the governments, ministries and agencies of our countries. . The negotiations were open, meaningful and effective, in accordance with the ancient traditions of friendship and brotherhood between our peoples. The current state of our cooperation was objectively assessed, its priorities and future tasks were clearly defined. An agreement was reached on the establishment of the Supreme Council of Strategic Partnership under the chairmanship of the heads of the two countries, - said the head of our state.

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
